Course Outcomes (COs):

CO1: Define ethics in public policy. Why is it essential for governance and policymaking?

Focus: Meaning of ethics, integrity, accountability, transparency, public trust.

CO2: Discuss the role of ethical leadership in shaping public policy.

Focus: Moral responsibility, decision-making, role models in governance, influence on institutions and citizens.

CO3: What are the major ethical dilemmas faced in public policy formulation and implementation?

Focus: Conflict of interest, corruption, favoritism, equity vs. efficiency, short-term politics vs. long-term sustainability.

CO4: Explain the relationship between ethics, good governance, and public interest.

Focus: Principles of good governance (participation, accountability, transparency, rule of law); how ethical leadership ensures public welfare.

CO5: Critically evaluate the importance of leadership styles in ethical public policymaking.

Focus: Transformational vs. transactional leadership, participatory leadership, servant leadership, examples from public administration.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PAPER SETTER/ EXAMINER:

- 1) The syllabus prescribed should be strictly adhered to.
